Task 2

Now you have generated your hero and your villain, I want you to have a try at telling a short story featuring both of them. You can do this in ANY way you want. You could write it as prose (a story), as a rhyme (like a Julia Donaldson story), as a comic strip, as a catchy song, as a thrilling play script, as a puppet show or in any other way you choose. Experiment with it and see what works best for you.

Remember, in stories the hero wants to stop the villain and the villain wants to stop the hero (think of Shere Khan in The Jungle Book, Lord Voldermort in Harry Potter and Darth Vader in Star Wars). I like to think of them as the two opposite sides of the same coin - one cannot exist without the other, but only one can 'win'.

In my story, my hero is a cat that is allergic to books and my hero is a wheelie bin that loves paperclips. In my story, the heroic tabby cat discovers the wheelie bin's evil plot to steal all the paperclips for itself, and confronts the wheelie bin... at the stationery shop, which is full of books!

Have a go at telling your story. I look forward to seeing what you come up with.
